What is an Apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a paid job where you will learn and gain valuable experience from your employer and your colleagues whilst studying towards a recognised qualification;

Alongside on-the-job training, an apprentice will spend at least 20% of their working hours completing off-the-job training which may include attending College or University, job shadowing colleagues or completing online training to upskill their knowledge.



Money - What Will You Get Paid? EARN WHILE YOU LEARN!

Age	Current hourly rate
Apprentice minimum wage	£7.55
Under 18	£7.55
Aged 19 or over and in your first year	£7.55
Aged 19-20 and have completed your first year	£10.00
Aged 21 or over and have completed your first year	£12.21

Example: A 16-year-old will work around 35 hours per week x £7.55 per hour = £264.25 per week minimum which is a minimum of £13,741.00 per year.
