

What is a T-Level?

T-Levels are new courses which can follow GCSEs.

Each T-Level is equivalent to 3 A levels.

T-Levels are studied over 2 years;

They were launched in September 2020 and developed in collaboration with employers and education providers.

The content of T-Levels has been created so that it meets the needs of industries, and it also prepares students for work, further training or further study;

Students study in a classroom environment but also gain valuable on-the-job experience through an industry placement of at least 315 hours, which equates to approximately 45 days;

You do not receive any pay when completing a T-Level, however, your placement may pay for travel expenses at their discretion.
